City Neighbors High School has a 93% graduation rate - and 100% of our students have a post graduation plan. We focus on college and career readiness through structured supports and intensives. Through pod and a college/career class, students apply and prepare for the SAT/ACT, apply to colleges, for scholarships and ensure they have a post secondary plan. Last year our students received 1.3 million dollars in scholarship offers - and many of our students go on to 4 year and 2 year colleges.

Each semester CCBC offers a college class to CNHS students at our school. Students who qualify and pass the Accuplacer can receive up to 15 credits.

HOME LIKE ATMOSPHERE IN SMALL SCHOOL MODEL

CNHS is known for our extraordinary Pod advisory model. Pods is the only extended advisory program of its kind in Baltimore. Meeting every day, 17 students and an advisor create a family dedicated to personal and academic achievement. Every Pod has a dedicated unique space in the school designed to support relationships, with individual work spaces, living rooms, kitchen areas, lockers, and a chance to be Known, Loved, and Inspired. Pods serve as the heart of CNHS.

The Pod group of students (17 per pod) and their advisor remain together from freshman year until graduation, they work on independent projects, complete course-work, participate in small group discussions and community building activities. Pods are also used to prepare for life after CNHS through the exploration of careers and colleges.
